

Rarely would anyone look at us and catch a clear glimpse of Jesus.


Lord, forgive us for taking the name without following the Christ.



#### **PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION**

#### FIRST SCRIPTURE LESSON

Matthew 21:23-32

When he entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him as he was teaching, and said, "By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?" <sup>24</sup>Jesus said to them, "I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things. <sup>25</sup>Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?" And they argued with one another, "If we say, From heaven,' he will say to us, Why then did you not believe him?' <sup>26</sup>But if we say, 'Of human origin,' we are afraid of the crowd; for all regard John as a prophet." <sup>27</sup>So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And he said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things.

<sup>28</sup> 'What do you think? A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.' <sup>29</sup>He answered, 'I will not'; but later he changed his mind and went. <sup>30</sup>The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, 'I go, sir'; but he did not go. <sup>31</sup>Which of the two did the will of his father?" They said, "The first." Jesus said to them, 'Truly I tell you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you. <sup>32</sup>For John came to you in the way of righteousness and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes believed him; and even after you saw it, you did not change your minds and believe him."







**Little Pantry Hunger Ministry.** The ongoing coronavirus epidemic and economic downturn are causing food insecurity across the region. Low-wage earners have been hit hard by layoffs and many working families are struggling to put food on the table. FCPC has responded with an outpouring of donations for Ives House, Welcome Table, and the Drop & Dash food drives. Now a new hunger ministry is opening up. FCPC librarian Avery Burns has suggested that the outdoor Little Library be converted to a mini food pantry during the economic downturn. The idea is to stock it with non-perishable food items so that our neighbors in need may pick up a few cans or boxes of food in a time of hardship.
