

O Lord, have mercy upon us. Forgive those who confess their faults.







### **SECOND SCRIPTURE LESSON**

Mark 9:38-50

<sup>38</sup>John said to him, "Teacher, we saw someone casting out demons in your name, and we tried to stop him, because he was not following us." <sup>39</sup>But Jesus said, "Do not stop him; for no one who does a deed of power in my name will be able soon afterward to speak evil of me. <sup>40</sup>W hoever is not against us is for us. <sup>41</sup>For truly I tell you, whoever gives you a cup of water to drink because you bear the name of Christ will by no means lose the reward.

<sup>42</sup> 'If any of you put a stumbling block before one of these little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you if a great millstone were hung around your neck and you were thrown into the sea. <sup>43</sup> If your hand causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life maimed than to have two hands and to go to hell, to the unquenchable fire. <sup>45</sup> And if your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life lame than to have two feet and to be thrown into hell. <sup>47</sup> And if your eye causes you to stumble, tear it out; it is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than to have two eyes and to be thrown into hell, <sup>48</sup> where their worm never dies, and the fire is never quenched.





Shout Out for Justice! (formerly Silent Witness), Oct. 9, Noon-1 p.m. along Broad Street. Now that students are back in classrooms, remember that even small instances of racism at school impact students of color in a big way. What does it look like? It's teachers and students who mispronounce the names of students of color saying they can't pronounce them; asking a student of color to select a new name that is easier to pronounce or remember; calling one student of color by another student's name as if they were indistinguishable; casual use of the n-word as a misguided expression of coolness; and teachers and administrators who do not call students out for this behavior. This cultivated environment harms students of color in the very buildings where they work so hard. Taken individually, these examples may seem insignificant but the toll over time is real. Microaggressions make students of color feel that they are not valued as much as white students, and ultimately, that the lives of students of color do not matter. **Introducing the Free Little Pantry.** FCPC is now home to a free little pantry. Similar to free little libraries, the little pantry is a grassroots crowdsourced solution to immediate and local need. Whether people have a need for food or a need to give, mini pantries help neighbors feed neighbors. You and your family can now adopt the new FCPC Little Pantry for one week (or more!). Stop by the pantry a few times during the week to make sure it is stocked and tidy. If inventory looks low, please purchase ready-to-eat items, toiletries, and disinfecting supplies to replenish it.
