



Opening Prayer

Revelation is a letter that was intended to be read aloud in worship. Although much of the text sounds bizarre to our modern ears, the images and references would have been familiar to its original audience. The twenty-four elders represent a heavenly counterpart to the people of God on earth, and the four living creatures represent the entire animal kingdom of God's creation.

<sup>1</sup> After this I heard what seemed to be the loud voice of a great multitude in heaven, saying, 'Hallelujah! Salvation and glory and power to our God, <sup>2</sup> for his judgments are true and just;

he has judged the great whore who corrupted the earth with her prostitution, and he has avenged on her the blood of his servants." <sup>3</sup> Once more they said, "Hallelujah! The smoke goes up from her forever and ever."

<sup>4</sup> And the twenty-four elders and the four living creatures fell down and worshiped God who is seated on the throne, saying, "Amen. Hallelujah!" <sup>5</sup> And from the throne came a voice saying, "Praise our God all you his servants and all who fear him, small and great." <sup>6</sup> Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the sound of many waters and like the sound of mighty thunderpeals, crying out, "Hallelujah! For the Lord God the Almighty reigns. <sup>7</sup> Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his bride has made herself ready; <sup>8</sup> to her it has been granted to be clothed with fine linen, bright and pure"—for the fine linen is the righteous

deeds of the saints. <sup>9</sup> And the angel said to me, "Write this: Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb." And he said to me, "These are true words of God."

<sup>22:17</sup> The Spirit and the bride say, "Come." And let everyone who hears say, "Come." And let everyone who is thirsty come. Let anyone who wishes take the water of life as a gift.




# Communion of the People

Invitation to the Table, Prayer of Thanksgiving, the Lord's Prayer

ALL: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.

#### Distribution of the Elements

Communion is by intinction. Receive bread into your open hand and dip it in the cup. Bread is gluten-free and cup is non-alcoholic. Those joining us on livestream are invited to use whatever elements you have at home to join in the Lord's Supper.
