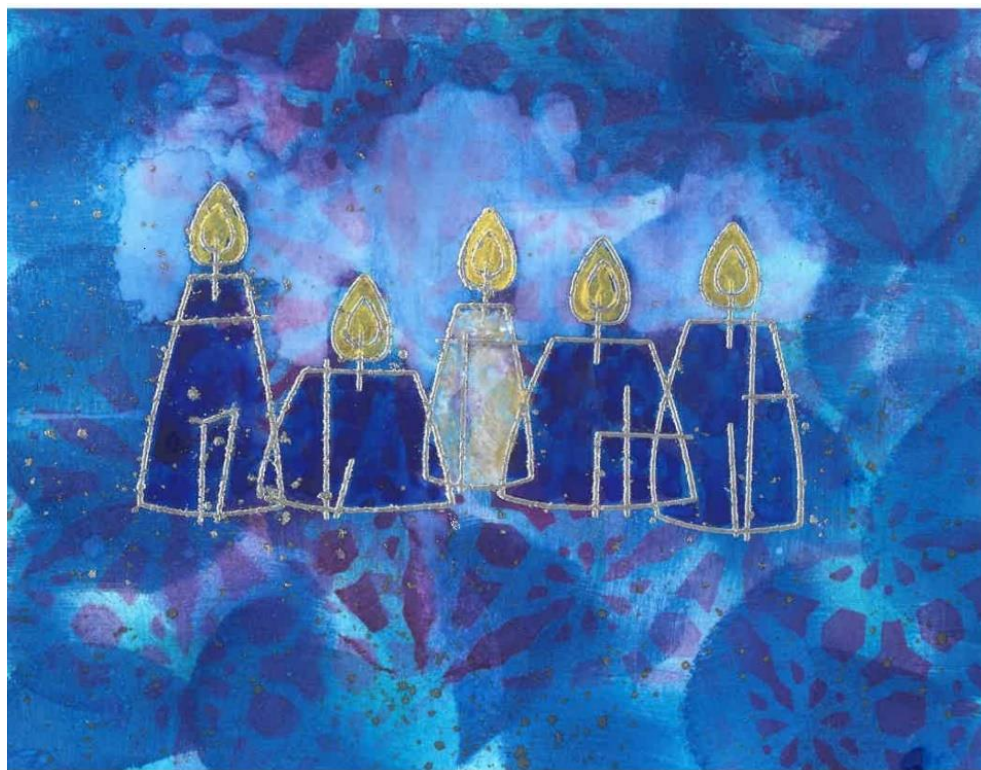


What Child is This?
